The agreement which was signed by Mr. Mbumba Haitengela, Executive Director in the Ministry of Sport, Youth and National Service and Mr. Jose Luis Reyero, Managing Director of Cadilu Fishing Pty Ltd, aim to fund the introduction of school football leagues for boys and girls within schools, in conjunction with the Real Madrid Foundation Program in order to develop talented players, through the establishment of four permanent schools in various regions.

The agreement outlines a strategic implementation in the areas of sport development in football and basketball, renovation of facilities for elite talents, capacity building of local coaches, training and skills development and exchange of athletes.

Mr Roger Kambatuku, National Coordinator of the Namibia Schools Sports Union (NSSU) emphasized that the project aims to reach over 1,000 children aged 6 to 16. The program's innovative approach integrates coaching lessons with social education, providing participants with invaluable life skills alongside athletic training. He further stated that the project was piloted with great success last year, in the towns of Windhoek, Walvis Bay, Otjiwarongo and Rundu. His Excellency Mr. Alberto de La Calle, Ambassador of Spain, attributed the program to the visionary leadership of the late former President, His Excellency Hage G. Geingob, whose conceptualization was behind the program.

The Ambassador further stated that he believes that the program will have profound impact on Namibian youth, by emphasizing the importance of instilling essential values. Mr Jose Luis Reyero, Managing Director of Cadilu Fishing, promised unwavering support to help young children reach their dreams, both academically and athletically.

Hon. Agnes Tjongarero, Minister of Sport, Youth and National Service, expressed gratitude to Cadilu Fishing for partnering with the Ministry on the Real Madrid Foundation program. "This partnership with Cadilu Fishing on the Real Madrid Foundation program, will empower the Namibian youth and foster holistic development. The partnership will also build a sustainable program that will leave a lasting impact on Namibia's youth."

GROUND BREAKING CEREMONY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE NKURENKURU MULTIPURPOSE YOUTH RESOURCE CENTER

In a vibrant display of community spirit, the Governor of Kavango West, recently hosted the eagerly anticipated Kavango West PSTBet Governor's Cup from 15 to 17 March 2024 in Nkurenkuru. The Cup aims to select a team that will represent Kavango West in the upcoming Nedbank Newspaper Cup. The PSTBet Governor's Cup also coincided with the symbolic handover of the site for the construction of the Nkurenkuru Multi – Purpose Youth Resource Centre, to the Ministry of Sport, Youth and National Service.

The construction of the Nkurenkuru Multi–Purpose Youth Resource Center, which is set to commence this month, will mark a significant milestone towards the commitment to sports development and talent identification, in the involved region. At the heart of the project lies a profound recognition of the importance of sports and recreation, in fostering holistic well-being. The planned facilities aim to provide a conducive environment for youth engagement, promoting physical health, mental health and emotional wellness.

The Nkurenkuru Town Council donated 21 hectares of land to the Ministry of Sport, Youth and National Service, as testimony of the shared vision for uplifting the youth in the Kavango West. Funding for the project will come from MSYNS which has allocated an initial N\$10 million for Phase 1 A and B. These phases will include feasibility studies, design documentation, and the layout of the government planning process.



Hon. Sirkka Ausiku, Governor of the Kavango West Region, conveyed a plea on behalf of the youth in the region, for the Ministry to ensure that the allocated funds are appropriately utilized

Hon. Emma Kantema—Gaomas, Deputy Minister echoed the sentiment that the construction signifies more than mere infrastructure development. "It symbolizes a dedication to nurturing the region's young talent and creating a solid foundation for their future endeavors, in alignment with the visionary legacy of our former President, inclusivity of the multi-purpose construction as it will the late Hage Geingob." The Deputy Minister further emphasized the inclusivity of the multi-purpose construction as it will allow for a soccer field and courts for both netball and basketball.

In conclusion, Hon. Kantema—Gaomas indicated that the commencement of construction on the Nkurenkuru Multi–Purpose Youth Resource Centre not only embodies bricks and mortar but the collective aspirations of a community united in its dedication to empowering its youth.



MALE ENGAGEMENT SESSION HELD AT LÜDERITZ

Fo promote meaningful dialogue and explore pathways for positive change, the Ministry of Sport, Youth, and National Service organized a Male Engagement session on Friday, 29 March 2024. The session attracted more than 30 participants, aged 15 to 35 years, at !Nami‡Nûs constituency, the coastal southern town of Lüderitz in the Kharas region. The programme implementation was made possible with the support of people from the Republic of America through the USAIDs PEPFAR funding mechanism.

The sessions aimed to delve into the role of adolescent boys and young men in initiating constructive transformations within their communities and promoting gender equality. Commencing with a thought-provoking question, "What role do you think young men can play in creating positive change in their communities?" the participants embarked on a journey of self-reflection and shared perspectives.

The conversations were diverse, honest and touched upon various aspects of masculinity, relationships, and societal dynamics. One of the focal points of discussion revolved around the challenges men face in contemporary society. Participants voiced their concerns about societal expectations, mental health stigma, and the pressure to conform to traditional gender norms.

The remarks from some participants were:

"The most difficult thing about being a man is the burden of expectations that we carry, often without a space to express vulnerability"

- "Managing bills"
- "Being the man of the house"
- "Dealing with relationship conflicts"
- "Managing stress"
- "Bouncing back after failure"
- "Facing derogatory remarks"
- "Coping with heartbreak"
- "Starting anew later in life"
- "Having a voice"

Concerning exploring interpersonal dynamics, participants delved into the complexities of understanding women. Questions such as "What do you find difficult to understand about women?" sparked introspection and dialogue on communication, empathy, and the importance of mutual respect.

The session also underscored the significance of fostering empathy and actively listening to women's experiences to bridge gaps in understanding. In highlighting the importance of solidarity and allyship, the discussion shifted towards how men can support women in their pursuit of equality and empowerment. From advocating for gender-inclusive policies to challenging patriarchal attitudes, participants emphasized the necessity of being active allies in the fight against gender-based discrimination.

Furthermore, participants reflected on the reciprocal nature of understanding between genders. "Women need to better understand that men also grapple with societal pressures and emotional vulnerabilities," remarked a participant.

The session emphasized the need for mutual empathy and recognition of shared struggles to foster healthier relationships and societal dynamics. Young men acknowledged the positive male influences in their lives. From mentors and role models to supportive friends and family members, these individuals were praised for their guidance, encouragement, and unwavering support. Participants highlighted qualities such as empathy, integrity, and resilience as defining characteristics of positive male influencers.

In conclusion, the Male Engagement Session catalyzed introspection, dialogue, and collective action. By fostering empathy, understanding, and solidarity, the participants reaffirmed their commitment to creating inclusive and equitable communities where all individuals can thrive, irrespective of gender.
